POVERTY and INEQUALITY

- 10 of the 15 most unequal countries are in Latin America
- > 38% people economically vulnerable
- Multi-dimensional poverty

CLIMATE CHANGE

- More extreme weather events
- Droughts, floods
- Rising sea levels
- Diminishing polar ice
- Ecosystem collapse
- Declining crop yields





What are the impacts...

- ≻ Hunger
- Access to education
- Access to care (health and well-being)
- Work and employment
- Lack of safety (gender, age)





What are the impacts...

Violence and citizen insecurity

- Against women, children, minorities
- Against gender identity
- Against indigenous people who defend the environment
- Organised crime
- Migration
- Forced displacement



Average homicide rate in Latin America =

> **3.5x greater** than global rate

On average, 12 women killed each day

27% women experience physical violence What are the impacts...

- Gender parity






PUBLIC POLICIES
